

HASS - History

Hello to all our parents, caregivers and families,


This week is National Science Week, and Miss Prakhoff has been working with classes on new and exciting activities to stimulate our students' interest in science.

Next week is Book Week, and next Friday, 24th August, we would like you to dress as your favourite book character at school, ready for the Book Week parade at K2's assembly in the morning. I look forward to seeing all of the characters then.

Last week we welcomed four players from the Fremantle Football Club as they continued their links with our school. Mitch Crowden, Lloyd Meek, Stefan Giro and Tom North gave talks to our Year 4 to 6 students on Bullying and Social Responsibility. In the final part of the program, some students will have a chance to visit the Dockers' new training facilities at Cockburn ARC.

On the subject of bullying and social responsibility, I have spoken to a number of students about what bullying actually means, and how we can work out what is happening, as it can seem confusing. I like to think of it in the following way:

When someone says or does something
unintentionally hurtful
and they do it once, that's
RUDE



When someone says or does something
intentionally hurtful
and they do it once, that's
MEAN



When someone says or does something
intentionally hurtful and they *keep doing it* -
even when you tell them to stop or show
them that you're upset - that's
BULLYING



I acknowledge that there are some ongoing behaviour issues at our school, but I can assure you that every single incident is investigated and dealt with in the most appropriate manner, according to our school's behaviour management policy. I also recognise that hearing that your child is not happy at school is a difficult thing to hear. I am a parent myself and I understand the frustration when things are not fixed instantly. Again, I ask for your support in allowing us to manage behaviour, and in return I would like you to know that a safe learning environment is our main focus as we seek to improve outcomes for our students.

On a brighter note, it has been great to see so many of our students giving their very best effort, despite the disruptions to staffing at school this term. The majority of students have coped admirably and I would like to thank them for that.

Term 3 is traditionally athletics season, but with the combination of lots of rainy days and Mr Oliphant's injury, we have not been able to give our students the consistent program that we would have hoped for. As a result, I have made the difficult decision to withdraw Lockridge from this year's interschool carnival, due to a lack of preparation. We will also push our school carnival into Term 4, when the weather will be better and our students have had a longer period of preparation and practice. We have put some measures into place to hopefully secure the PE program into Term 4 so that we can give the students the best possible school carnival and the chance to compete and succeed. I hope you will understand these decisions. We will resume interschool activities once we have a settled PE program.

Finally, one of our key messages has been about pride in our school. A key part of that is uniform. Please see the article in this newsletter about school uniform and encourage your children to wear it every day to convey the message "Proud To Be Lockridge".
