Development of aligned practices in Literacy and Handwriting, to decrease the cognitive load for students.




An increase in support provisions for our K-6 student cohort, including those most at risk.






We will further sharpen our focus on measuring the impact of our teaching and the effectiveness of our programs, at the individual teacher and phase of learning level, through strengthened data literacy.




The impact of COVID and a move to online testing was reflected in some of our 2021 data. Pleasingly however, 2022 data reflected an upturn in performance in many areas.






SYSTEM DATA - NAPLAN & ON-ENTRY





NAPLAN and other student data has clearly identified reading as an area of priority from 2023. This has been stipulated in our 2023-2025 School Plan 'Reaching Higher', with staff to engage in best practice reading instruction, professional learning and target setting to ensure our students become skilled readers. **On-Entry** data (below), also indicates a need to focus on reading skills, in an effort to ensure our students are best prepared in Kindergarten to begin their formal schooling from Pre-Primary.
