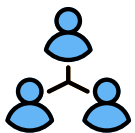

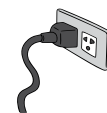

2022 Milestones & Target Snapshot

When developing our 2020 - 2022 School Plan, we made a range of commitments stating "*by 2022, you will see...*". We are thrilled that we have met or exceeded almost all of our commitments, with some of the highlights being:



The development of our Connected Practice Pedagogical Commitment, to drive quality teaching and learning.



100% of classroom-based staff engaged in 'peer observation' to strengthen the quality of their pedagogy and practice.



A continued upward trend of 'agree'/'strongly agree' selected by parents/carers via NSOS (4.0>).



Attendance data closer to state average and for some cohorts, exceeding previous years improvements.



Successful attainment of Level 3 Teacher status by two of our staff.



Meeting five of the National Quality Standards whilst successfully working towards two others.



The creation of a LPS NAIDOC shirt by our Karrak Families.



A continued downward trend in suspensions, resulting in a 90% decrease from 2019.



Development of aligned practices in Literacy and Handwriting, to decrease the cognitive load for students.



An increase in support provisions for our K-6 student cohort, including those most at risk.

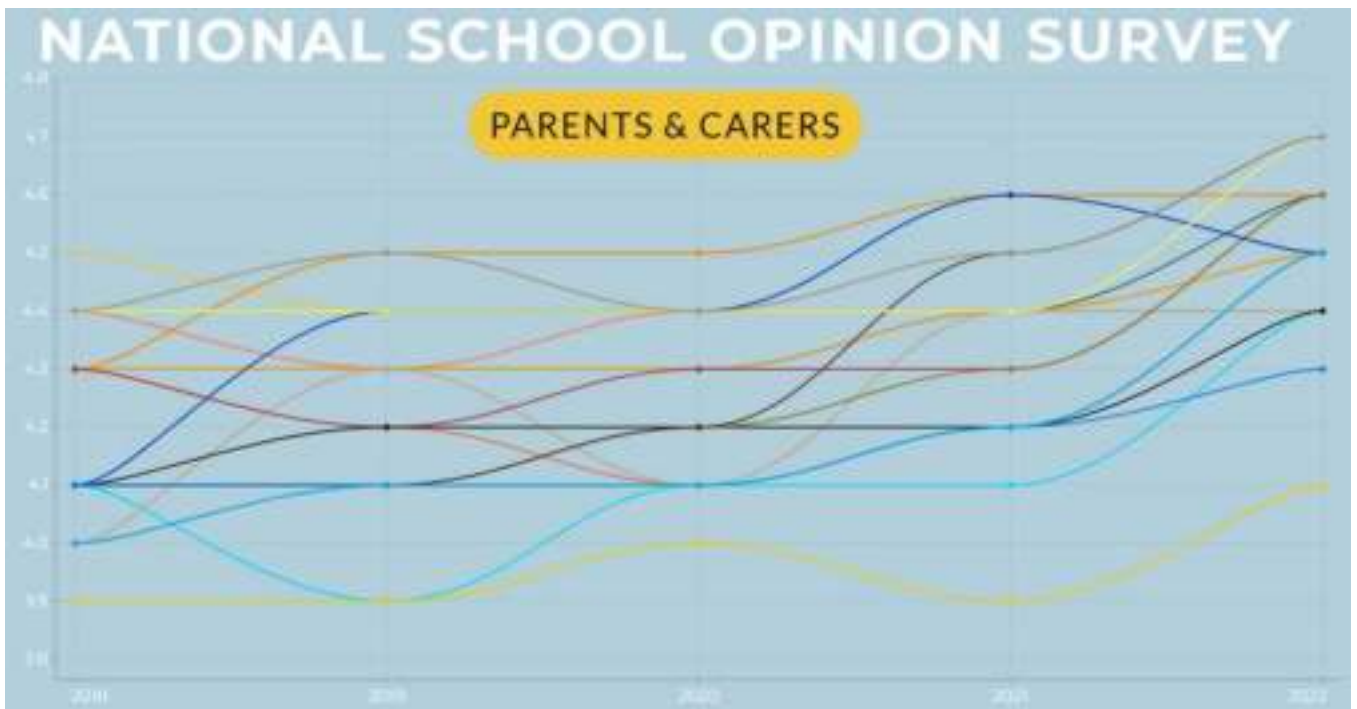
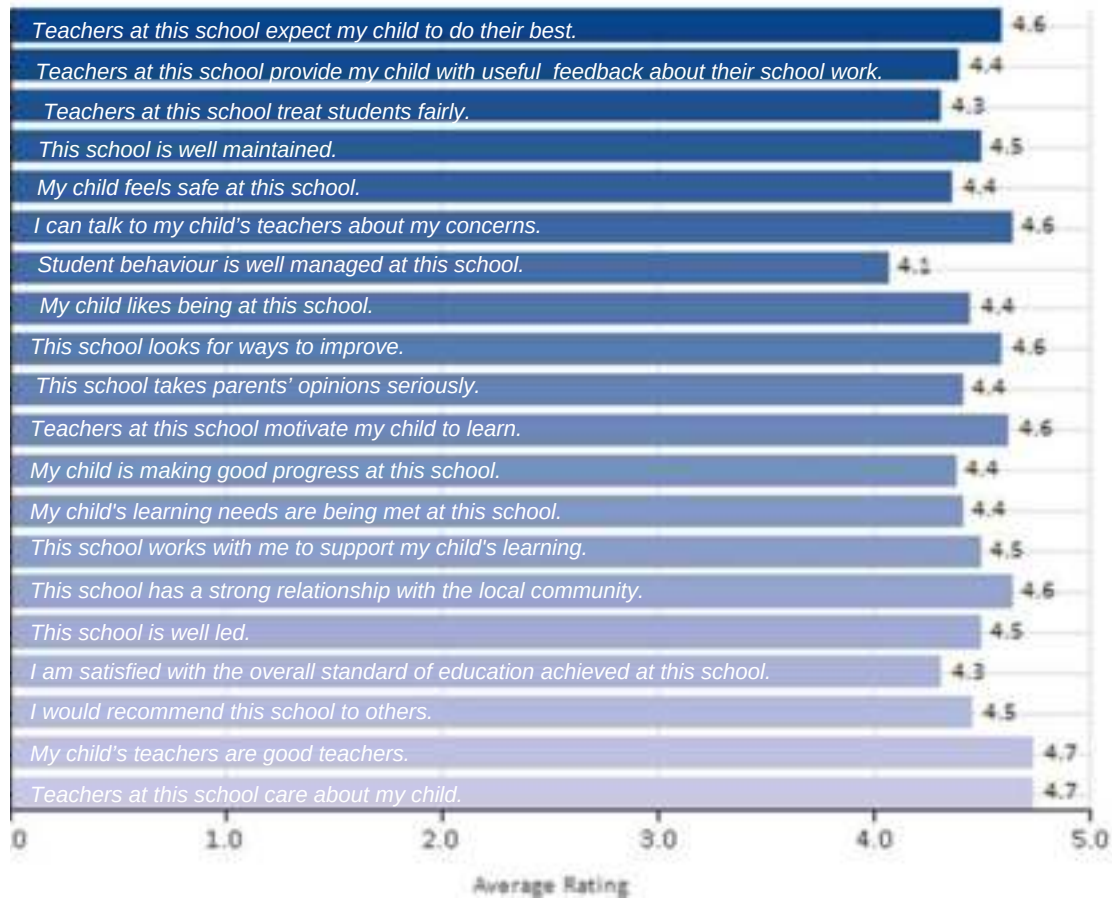

We will further sharpen our focus on measuring the impact of our teaching and the effectiveness of our programs, at the individual teacher and phase of learning level, through strengthened data literacy.

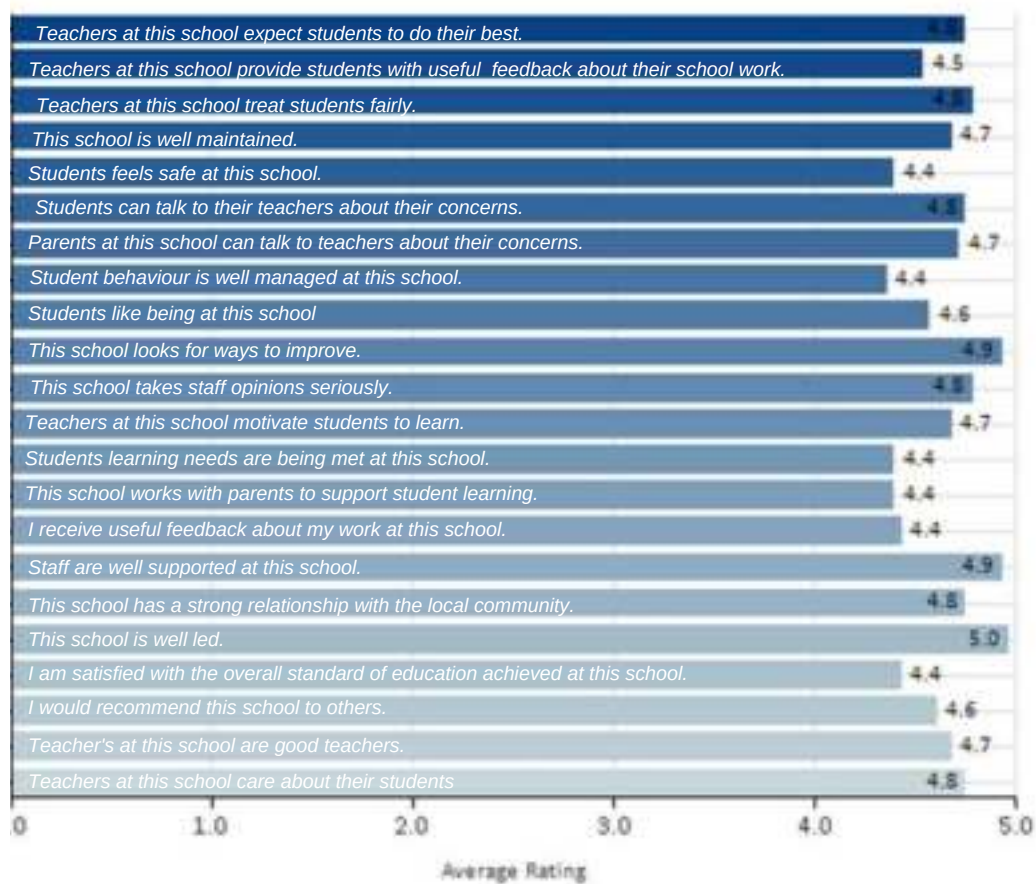


PARENT/CARER FEEDBACK

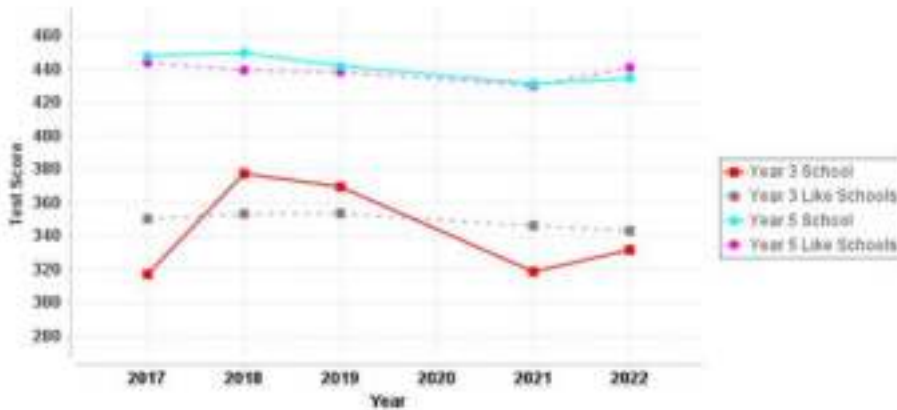

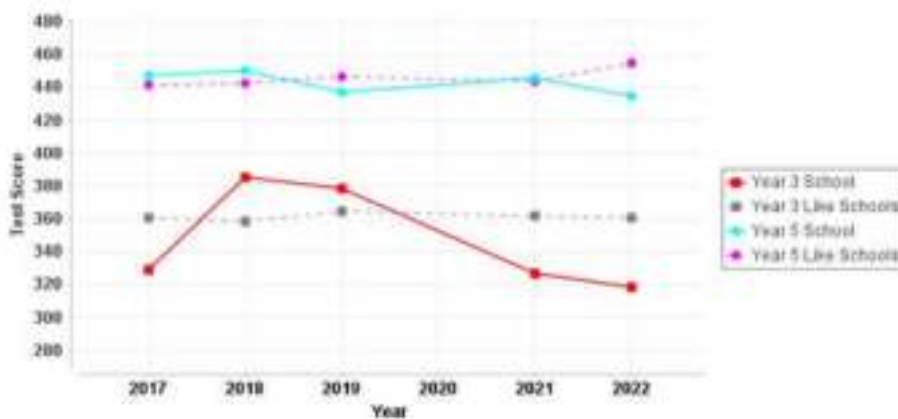
SYSTEM DATA - NAPLAN

The impact of COVID and a move to online testing was reflected in some of our 2021 data. Pleasingly however, 2022 data reflected an upturn in performance in many areas.

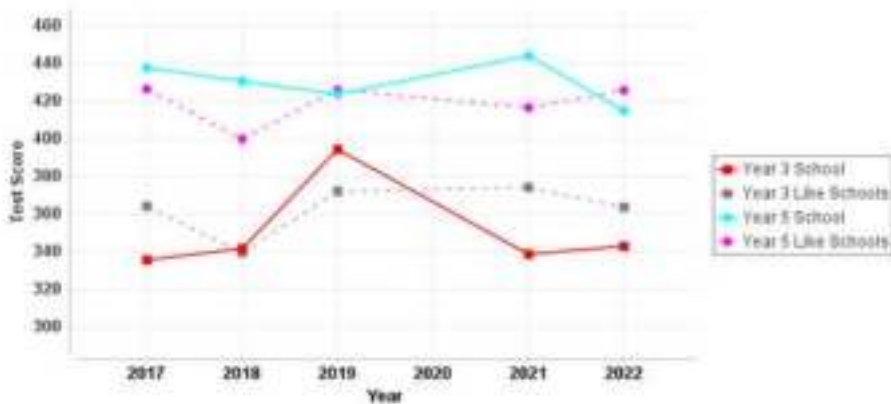
Average Numeracy Score



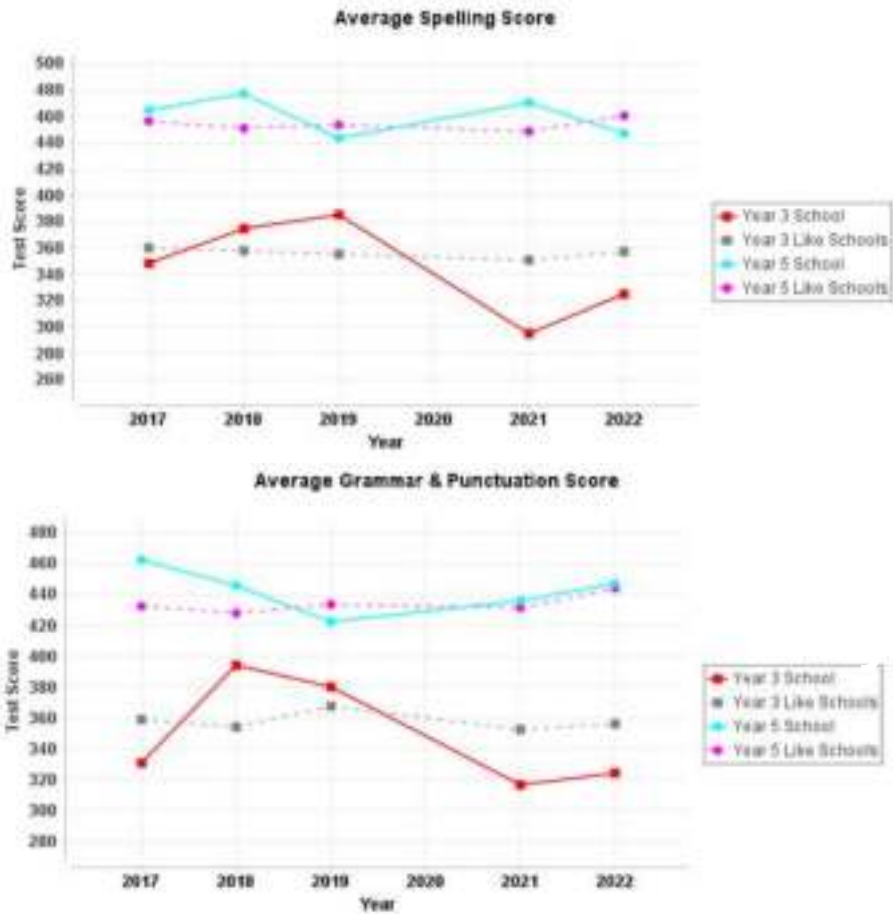
Average Reading Score



Average Writing Score



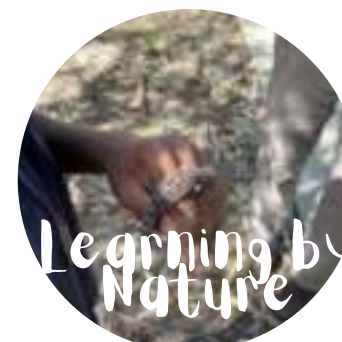
SYSTEM DATA - NAPLAN & ON-ENTRY



NAPLAN and other student data has clearly identified reading as an area of priority from 2023. This has been stipulated in our 2023-2025 School Plan 'Reaching Higher', with staff to engage in best practice reading instruction, professional learning and target setting to ensure our students become skilled readers. **On-Entry** data (below), also indicates a need to focus on reading skills, in an effort to ensure our students are best prepared in Kindergarten to begin their formal schooling from Pre-Primary.
